Auditioned Scholarships

GENERAL INFORMATION AND GUIDELINES

- The student's name, age, contact information, category, titles and duration of each piece <u>must</u> be stated on the submitted entry. Submissions can be entered online or over the phone by calling our Student Services office at (306) 585-5748 instructions can be found at the end of this booklet.
- <u>Deadline for submissions is 11:59 p.m. on Wednesday, March 6, 2024</u> along with the corresponding registration fee.
- Late submissions will not be accepted.
- **Registration fees** for 2024 will be \$25 per entry.
- Auditions will be at the Conservatory the weekend of March 23-24, 2024. The schedule of performances will be sent to participants no later than March 15, 2024.
- The awards will be presented at the Celebration of Excellence on June 09, 2024.
- Awarding of some scholarships and awards will be dependent on the receipt of funds from the donors, which will be confirmed after the deadline for submissions.
- Scholarships not used by June 30, 2024 are no longer available to the student.
- Monies awarded are intended for further musical study at the Conservatory of Performing Arts or a post- secondary accredited music program, unless otherwise stated.
- Scholarship recipients may re-enter in the same category in subsequent auditions, but no repetition of previous repertoire performed in the audition will be accepted.
- Students applying to both intermediate and senior auditions must perform different repertoire at each audition.
- Students are responsible for all accompanist costs related to auditioned scholarships.
- Proper recital deportment is expected from all students.
- Auditioned Scholarship Recitals are open to the public, and the public is cordially invited to attend.
- The Head of the appropriate department shall approve the submitted program. The submitted program must be precisely followed at the time of recital. All musical qualities being equal, memorization may be the deciding factor.

TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR AUDITIONED SCHOLARSHIPS:

- Conservatory students must have attended at least 10 lessons during the current scholarship year (September 1, 2023 to March 13, 2024) prior to submitting a scholarship application
- To be considered for any award or prize, Conservatory students must have participated in at least one Conservatory Recital PRIOR to March 16, 2024

SENIOR REQUIREMENTS

- Students registered at the University of Regina or Conservatory of Performing Arts, wishing to audition for the Senior awards must submit, for approval by the Committee, a balanced program of two to three pieces at a senior level that meets the requirements of the department, to a maximum of 20 minutes (Voice, Winds/Brass, Piano) or 25 minutes (Strings)
- Maximum age limit for Senior Auditioned Scholarships is 25 for instrumentalists and 28 for vocalists as of January 1, 2024.

JUNIOR AND INTERMEDIATE REQUIREMENTS

- Students registered at the University of Regina Conservatory of Performing Arts, wishing to audition for the Junior/Intermediate awards must submit, for approval by the Committee, a balanced program of two or three pieces that demonstrate musicality and technical ability to a <u>maximum of 15 minutes</u>
- The maximum age for Junior and Intermediate Scholarships is 17 as of January 1, 2024

DETAILED DESCRIPTION OF ADULT AUDITIONED SCHOLARSHIPS

Mary Louise Isabelle Voice Award

\$1000.00 X 2

One award is to be given to an adult over age of 21 and the other to an adult over the age of 30 who in the opinion of the adjudicator best deserves the award. Financial need and performance are the criteria to be taken into consideration.

The singer must perform a program of approximately 10 minutes in length. The student must be studying towards an exam of a Grade VII level or higher from a recognized school of music or other Conservatory (e.g. Royal Conservatory of Toronto, Conservatory Canada, etc.) Those singing for the scholarship may write a letter to the Head of the Conservatory outlining their financial need.

Bursaries

GENERAL INFORMATION AND GUIDELINES

- (1) Conservatory bursaries are based on financial need.
- (2) Conservatory bursaries follow a different application process than the auditioned and non-auditioned scholarships and awards.
- (3) Deadlines and applications are separate from auditioned and non-auditioned scholarships. Students may apply anytime during the fall or winter semester. All applications received between February 16 and October 15 deadline are considered in the week following October 15 and awarded by the end of October. All applications received between October 6 and February 15 are considered during the week following February 15 and awarded by the end of February.
- (4) Upon receipt of written consent from the recipient, parent or legal guardian, the presentation of these bursaries will be included at the Conservatory Celebration of Excellence in June.
- (5) Please speak to either your instructor, Department Head, the Head of the Conservatory or the office staff for more information.

Hallie McCall Inglis Bursary in Music

These bursaries will be awarded to 2 Conservatory of Performing Arts students who meet the following criteria:

demonstrated financial need, continued study at the Conservatory of Performing Arts, a minimum of 3 years of instruction in music at the Conservatory of Performing Arts is required. One will be awarded in the fall and the other in the winter. If not awarded through the bursary process, these awards will be distributed based on the recommendation of the Conservatory Scholarship Committee.

Therens Memorial Award in Music

\$1,300

Recipient is to be a meritorious student studying music.. This bursary may be split between students who have cited financial need and have been a student at the Conservatory of Performing Arts for at least one year. If not awarded through the bursary process, these awards will be distributed based on the recommendation of the Conservatory Scholarship Committee.

Non-Auditioned Scholarships

GENERAL INFORMATION AND GUIDELINES

The Conservatory offers a large number of honours and awards to students each year. Teachers should enter as many deserving students as possible to make sure the competition for scholarships remains strong. Students are also encouraged to submit an application themselves.

Each year, different members of the Faculty are asked to join the Scholarship Committee (consisting of Heads of Departments, plus one Faculty member of each Department, plus the Conservatory Head). Participation entails judging students in your own field (string, piano, etc.), on a sub-committee, as well as joining the full committee in discussing Conservatory-wide awards (Director's Gold Medal, etc.).

- (1) All awards/honours received by the student since June 1, 2023, are eligible for inclusion. (i.e., Provincial honours, band, orchestra and choir participation, and any honours received during the last Saskatchewan Music Festival Association competitions).
- (2) All awards/honours at all grade levels should be included.
- (3) Students must have attended at least 10 lessons during the scholarship year: September 1, 2023 to May 1, 2024.
- (4) To be considered for any award or scholarship, students must have appeared in at least ONE Conservatory recital prior to submitting a scholarship application.
- (5) Please submit all student recommendations for non-auditioned awards via the online system <u>BY</u> <u>11:59pm</u>, <u>Friday</u>, <u>MAY 10</u>, <u>2024</u>. Scholarship Entry/Recommendation Forms which do not include ALL THE NECESSARY INFORMATION will be considered incomplete and ineligible for consideration.
- (6) Scholarships not used by June 30, 2024 are no longer available to the student.
- (7) The age limit of the various Awards and Scholarships is as of January 1, 2024.
- (8) Awards and scholarships will be applied to student accounts by the end of June in the year they are awarded
- (9) Awarding of scholarships and awards will be dependent on the receipt of funds from the donors, which will be confirmed after the deadline for submissions.
- (10) Monies awarded must be used at the Conservatory of Performing Arts, the University of Regina for a music program, or another post-secondary accredited music institution.
- (11) The deliberations of the Scholarship Committee are confidential and the decisions are final, no appeals will be considered.

PIANO

Ast Music Awards for Piano \$2000

Up to \$2000 can be divided between a number of piano students based on the recommendation of the Conservatory Scholarship Committee.

Bee/Wallis Piano Scholarship \$450

To be awarded to a Piano student in the upper intermediate level (Grades 8 or 9 RCM), studying at the Conservatory of Performing Arts, University of Regina.

- No scholarship need be awarded if a suitable candidate is not available.
- The scholarship may be paid to an accredited musical institution where the student intends to continue studying.

Dorothy Bee Scholarship \$1,700

To be awarded to an advanced piano student, studying at Grade 9 level or higher, who is continuing studies at the Conservatory or continuing to study music at an accredited music school. The scholarship may be divided with equal amounts to two recipients, based on the recommendation of the Conservatory Scholarship Committee.

Gaylord Wight Memorial Scholarship \$1,000

To be awarded in the area of piano based on the recommendation of the Conservatory Scholarship Committee. This award may be split between multiple recipients

Joan Eremko Award for Piano \$700 x 2

The award will be presented to a Conservatory of Performing Arts student who meets the following criteria: continuing piano study at the Conservatory of Performing Arts – University of Regina; or currently enrolled in piano at the Conservatory of Performing Arts – University of Regina and who will be entering the Faculty of Media, Art and Performance at the University of Regina in the upcoming fall term continuing their studies in piano.

Nadia Woroby Memorial Music Scholarship (Piano or Violin) \$1,100

To be awarded to a student, ages of 12–18 years old, studying either piano or violin who has demonstrated outstanding musical talent in the given year as exhibited in musical festivals, recitals and/or examinations. In the event of two or more equally qualified candidates, preference will be given to the student who has not received other Conservatory scholarships in the award year. Past recipients are eligible to receive this award more than once, but no more than 3 times.

WINDS & BRASS

Conservatory Gala Scholarship

"This award is given to deserving wind and brass students at the "junior" and "intermediate" levels. By tradition, it has been divided into \$50 units, but may be given as one award. All recipients must have played in at least one Conservatory Recital. Such factors as exam results, festival marks and placement and general playing ability will be considered."

Williams Family Award in Wind and Brass - Non-Auditioned

\$750

\$600 to be distributed to a single wind or brass student or divided between a number of wind and/or brass students based on the recommendation of the Conservatory Scholarship Committee.

The scholarship will be awarded to students who meet the following criteria:

- -are pursuing studies in a wind and/or brass instrument
- -demonstrate ability and technique in their chosen wind and/or brass instrument
- -display hard work and express a passion for their instrument, but do not necessarily demonstrate the most talent

Conservatory of Performing Arts Trophy for Winds and Brass

"Traditionally, this trophy has been given to a player 14 or younger (though not specified), who is studying at a junior level of performance. As with similar awards, the recipient will have played in at least one Conservatory recital. General level of performance, progress, exam results and festival marks and placement may all be considered, but are not necessarily equally weighted."

Conservatory of Performing Arts Silver Medal for Winds

"Typically, the recipient of this award will be a student at the senior level who has been very active in his/her music studies (playing in a number of recitals, festivals, competitions and being active in ensembles (S.S.Y.O., etc.), and will have been a student at the institution for an extended period of time. Such factors as performance standard, senior exam results, awards, etc., will be taken into consideration."

Conservatory of Performing Arts Silver Medal Brass

"Typically, the recipient of this award will be a student at the senior level who has been very active in his/her music studies (playing in a number of recitals, festivals, competitions and being active in ensembles (S.S.Y.O., etc.), and will have been a student at the institution for an extended period of time.
